- Why do you think there are so many books of the Bible?
- Instead of using many different writers, and being written over a period of thousands of years, why didn't God just have one person write the entire Bible?
- What is the difference between the Old and New Testament? How are they similar?

He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms." Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. —Luke 24:44-45
